We live in a society that places premium value on physical appearance

It has become an acceptable substitute for inner character or personal talent

Self-image is a complicated topic in today's Christian community:

- "False <u>humility</u>" I am of no worth
- "Ungodly <u>vanity</u>" I can do anything

Diotrophes had a prideful character that made him a tyrant in the church

As we investigate Diotrophes' makeup, we begin to see God's definition of a healthy, successful selfimage

Realize Pride Tarnishes Our Personality v9

- Diotrophes "Zeus nourished"
- Apparently accepted the Gospel but kept his pagan name
- Diotrophes ignored and perhaps hid instruction from the Apostle John
- You can use godly things to promote pride of self!

Understand that Grace Creates a Loving Attitude v10

- Classic example of gracelessness:
 - o Critical tongue
 - o Exclusive circle of friends
 - o Domination
 - o Intimidation
- We who have tasted God's grace need to exercise the same towards others

Remember to Chose Your Heroes Carefully v11

- Diotrophes was exposed as a phony
- John reminds Gaius to imitate that which is good
- Choose heroes that stand for the truth
- Truth will be modeled in your personality
